You are responsible to keep accurate records of your projects and participation in 4-H. Marion 4-H member's record forms are designed to help you keep these records as easily as possible.

How you keep your record may make the difference whether or not you get selected for such things as 4-H Project Excellence Awards, Washington Focus, State 4-H Leadership Camp, Junior Fair Board, State Projects Achievement Recognition, College Scholarships and other exciting awards and leadership opportunities.

It is extremely important that you keep records of every year you are in 4-H in Marion or other counties. The pages are designed so all you have to do is add on each year's projects, activities, leadership, and 4-H story. It is a permanent record of your 4-H work and it serves as your application and or reference for most Marion County awards and leadership positions.

If you need extra pages or a new complete set, just stop in and pick them up or print them from the web. Marion County 4-H Member's Record Book cover pages are available at the Extension office.

Your "4-H Member's Record Book" contains six sections:

SECTION 1 - CURRENT YEAR PROJECT SUMMARY APPLICATION

The Project Summary Application contains the title of the leadership position(s) or award(s) being applied for that time; information about you, the applicant; when the entire application is due and where; and a place for your advisor's signature and your signature and date. This page will automatically be sent to all members eligible as specific award and leadership opportunities become available. It must be included as the first page of your application.

SECTION 2 - YOUR 4-H PROJECT RECORD

In each designated column list: (1) the year you took the project(s); (2) what project(s) you took; (3) the type and number of garments, dishes, plants, animals, etc. — use extra lines if needed; (4) where you exhibited; (5) county 4-H grade received; (6) any special project awards, trips, or placing you received; and (7) on the next line(s) below the project and related information, list any meetings, contests, or clinics you attended in relation to that project that year.
